

Coroner's Officer Association Generic Job Description

Coroner's Officer

Principal Purpose of the Role

To act as representative of H M Coroner in the investigation of any death referred and to make enquiries into potential treasure finds

Key Duties, Responsibilities and Accountabilities

- Record, assess and investigate all deaths reported to the coroner service obtaining all relevant information including social and medical history
- Attend and record scenes of death as directed by the coroner and ensure that all evidence for the coroner is safeguarded
- Gather evidence to assist the coroner in establishing the identity of the deceased
- Provide accurate and timely information and appropriate guidance to bereaved people for the duration of the coroner's inquiry
- Arrange for the transfer of the deceased to the designated mortuary
- Gather information for the coroner and pathologist and arrange and attend post mortem examinations as the coroner directs
- Ensure adequate information is provided to the coroner to facilitate the release of the body to the person legally entitled
- Inform and provide guidance to other properly interested persons and other agencies / professionals as appropriate
- Collate and record evidence of witnesses including that obtained by other agencies / professionals as appropriate and produce a case file
- Co-ordinate and attend inquest hearings as appropriate
- To record, assess and investigate reports of potential treasure
- Undertake such other reasonable duties as specified by the coroner or employer that are commensurate with the grade and responsibilities of the post

¹ Medical or legal knowledge and understanding or previous experience of working within the coroner service is seen as essential until mandatory training is supplied on commencement of the role; when it could be reclassified as desirable
